IDENTITY


- How you see yourself







THE INNER SELF

Fukuyama

Identity: the distinction between a person's true inner self and an external indication of the social roles and norms that do not sufficiently acknowledge the value or dignity of that inner self.

Characteristic of the modern age: people think that authentic inner self is intrinsically valuable, and that the outer society is systematically wrong and unfair in its appreciation of the former.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The inner sense of dignity calls for recognition.

It is not enough that I have a sense of self-worth if other people do not publicly acknowledge it or, even worse, if they trivialise me or do not acknowledge my existence.


DIGNITY

The inner self is the basis of human dignity

Formerly reserved for those who were willing to risk their lives in battle.

Now: attribute of all human beings, based on their intrinsic value as people with freedom of choice (I-culture).

Or based on belonging to a certain group with a collective memory and a shared experience (we-culture).



Andragogic discussion techniques

- Listening by imagining: ask for details that may be of significance.
- Listening by connecting: make further associations, unexpected twists and turns
- Listening by moving: listen from a different perspective, make someone else the protagonist
- Imaginary listening: listen to images and understand certain expressions as image

- Adult education should invite participants to tell them about who they are, not just to present themselves, but to connect their self-concept with the diversity in the surrounding world.
- The indirect or direct contact with people who look different, believe different things and do different things, the question arises as to who they are and who we are
- Identify differences, don't neglect them, explore how they function and how they can get productive
